PLAN #3 – 10 MONTH PAYMENT PLAN

Payments in ten monthly installments June 1, 2013-March 1, 2014. A carrying charge of \$100 will be added to your account.

PLAN #4 – 12 MONTH PAYMENT PLAN

Payments in twelve monthly installments June 1, 2013-May 1, 2014. A carrying charge of \$120 will be added to your account.

TUITION PAYMENT PLANS

If any amount of tuition, fees, fines or replacement costs for lost or damaged school property is not paid prior to the end of that semester, Luther North's Board of Trustees' policy states that all such students are to be withheld from enrolling and attending the next semester session. Official transcripts will be withheld until debt owed to LNCP is paid in full. The same policy applies to graduation. Students with any tuition, fees, fines or replacement costs in arrears will be withheld from graduation ceremonies, and receipt of transcripts and/or diploma will be withheld until such debts and resultant fines are paid in full. Payments made by personal check, business check, or online by ACH will be subject to a 14 day hold to allow for clearance of funds.

FINANCIAL AID

A substantial number of LNCP students receive financial aid. The Financial Aid Program assures that talented students will not be denied a LNCP education due to financial circumstances. Financial aid is funded through the Endowment Program and the generous donations of alumni and supporters. **Families must apply each year for financial assistance.**

February 2013 – all current and incoming students will be sent a financial aid packet with the process to apply for financial aid. In order to apply, the \$250.00 registration fee must be paid.

Financial aid applications are submitted and processed monthly for the months of March, April, and May. **We cannot guarantee any financial aid to those who apply after May 1, 2013.**

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT FINANCIAL AID

- All scholarships, grants and/or tuition discounts are applied towards tuition only. All required fees are the responsibility of those paying each student's bill. This amount is pro-rated by month or payment plan equally distributed through the year to ensure full term attendance.
- The scholarships, grants, and/or tuition discounts are determined by the length of enrollment, eligibility, and/or qualification during any given year. Financial assistance in the case of termination of enrollment or eligibility is not refundable, just as required fees are not refundable.

- In the case of congregational or organizational assistance, the family in question needs to pay all tuition and fees until that money is received. If the money is received before March 10 of each school year, it is applied to that individual's remaining tuition bill and if the total amount is in excess of the tuition bill, the congregation making the contribution will be notified and either the surplus will be returned to the congregation or organization or applied to the student's next year's tuition bill. If the money is received after March 10, the amount will be automatically applied to the student's next year's tuition bill. Congregations or other contributing organizations will be the sole determiner of who qualifies for this aid.
- In each payment plan, required fees are included in the first payment. These are not refundable under any circumstances, nor are they discounted due to the school financial assistance program. Tuition is non-refundable once a semester has begun.
- Each person responsible for each family's tuition fee bill must sign the "Luther North College Prep Financial Commitment Form" and "Smart Tuition Form" before any tuition scholarships, grants, or discounts are applied to the tuition bill.
- There must be demonstrated financial need as evidenced by information supplied by information on the Cross Star Grant-in-Aid Application, 2012 Tax Returns, and W2's.
- All required forms and procedures must be completed by the published deadlines.
- Students must maintain passing grades; failures or multiple "D" grades will eliminate them from program participation. In addition, any student put on disciplinary probation may also eliminate them from program participation.
- Mandatory meeting with admissions committee.



2013-2014 FAMILY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Introduction: The goal of LNCP's "**Family Financial Assistance Program**" is to establish a financial partnership with families to make the LNCP educational experience more affordable. This program provides funds for financially challenged families and/or gifted and talented students. LNCP's financial assistance program involves four types of tuition assistance or opportunities for assistance which are as follows:

1. **Merit Awards:** Offered to all who qualify
2. **Entitlement Grants:** Granted to all that are entitled
3. **Need-based Awards:** Granted to all who qualify
4. **Incentive Grants:** Granted to those who fulfill the incentive

A significant number of LNCP students receive some kind of financial aid each year. We believe our financial aid program assures that students will not be denied an education due to financial circumstances. The financial aid program is funded annually through various sources including:

- **LNCP School Endowments** – A portion of the interest accumulated each year from the Endowments assists the funding of "scholarships."
- **Generous Alumni and Donors** – Thankful alumni and appreciative donors, who throughout their lives recognize the value of a LNCP education, have committed significant amounts toward the annual scholarship fund.
- **Association Congregations** – Many congregations, because they view LNCP as an extension of their own ministry, contribute a determined amount of money, for LNCP students in good standing, from their school or church. This money is applied to their members' and/or school graduates' tuition bills each fiscal year.
- **Annual Appeals (Development efforts of LNCP)** – Each year LNCP has appeals to alumni, friends and donors for the scholarship program.
- **Tuition Discounts** – Annually, LNCP budgets for an expected number of students as well as expected income to finance our financial assistance program. Our budget is predicated (as a non-profit institution) on the attempt to balance revenue with expenditures. Therefore, a projected amount is set as "tuition discounts." This amount is affected by the enrollment – if the projected number is reached, we can allocate the budgeted amount of tuition discounts in the financial assistance program.

Each student must be enrolled, registered, and in attendance before any financial assistance will be applied to tuition bills. NOTE ALL DEADLINES INVOLVING APPLICATION FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE!

Freshman Scholarship Program

Luther North College Prep awards 6 incoming freshmen students with academic scholarships in amounts ranging from \$3,000-\$6,000.

Criteria to qualify:

1. Must qualify on the entrance exam in December – top 15% on the standardized test
2. After qualifying on the exam:
 - a. Submit 2 letters of recommendation
 - b. 8th grade first semester report card
 - c. Essay – What are your academic, personal and extracurricular goals for high school? (one-two pages typed)

Scholarship is for 4 years as long as the following criteria are met:

1. Maintain 3.5 GPA
2. Participate in 2 extra-curricular activities per year
3. Ten service hours to the school

Servant Talent Leadership-(Open to Juniors or Seniors)

The servant-talent-leadership grant is awarded to students who demonstrate evidence of exceptional servant-talent-leadership. **Students must apply each year to receive.** In order to make application for this grant, the candidate must submit two documents:

1. Recommendation form – The student applicant must be recommended by a school-related or church-related staff member as one who has demonstrated talent-leadership qualities, the potential for future development, and provide LNCP with leadership character recommendations by submitting the completed “Personal Recommendation Form”.
2. Personal Statement – The student is asked to prepare a 1-2 page typed essay on the topic, “How I am using my God-given talent to serve God by serving others.”

Fine Arts Academy Scholarships

4 scholarships will be awarded, 1 in each of the following disciplines:

- Instrumental Arts
- Theater Arts
- Visual Arts
- Vocal Arts

Scholarships are \$1000 per year and renewable for 4 years if the criteria are met (see below).

Instrumental Arts

Audition Requirements

Wind instrumentalists: Demonstrate your musical progress through two short pieces; one lyrical and one technical. Areas observed will include tone quality, instrumental technique, rhythmic accuracy, intonation, dynamics, musical interpretation/style and phrasing. The audition will also include a brief sight reading.

Percussionists: Demonstrate your musical progress through two short pieces; preferably one on snare drum and one on either keyboard percussion or timpani. Areas observed will include stick/mallet choice, stick/mallet control, rudiments, rhythmic accuracy, dynamics and musical interpretation/style. Be prepared to speak about your performance experience with keyboard percussion, timpani and drum set. The audition will also include a brief sight reading.

Criteria for retention of instrumental music scholarship

- Student will participate in all concert band/pep band performances.
- Student will participate in jazz band if instrument is saxophone, trumpet, trombone, piano, guitar, bass or drums.
- Student will support elementary band program by performing in recruitment ensemble.
- Student will prepare IMEA District Band audition music. Juniors and seniors will take the audition; freshmen and sophomores will take the audition if they are performing at the appropriate level.
- Student will participate in the IHSA Solo and Ensemble Contest.
- Students must attend one musical performance (college or professional) per semester and write a review of the performance.

Theater Arts

Audition Requirements

Each student will participate in a live audition to include the following:

- Prepare one (1) monologue. Monologue must be memorized. Monologues must be chosen from published plays. Scripts from movies are unacceptable. Maximum monologue time is a total of three minutes. Check your material carefully to ensure that you meet this time limit as you will be timed.
- Students will be asked to participate in a cold reading exercise.

Criteria for retention of theater arts scholarship

- Perform in at least two (2) productions during each production year for LNCP
- Participate in at least one (1) production as stage/set crew during each production year.
- Maintain a 3.0 (B), or higher, average in theatre arts/fine arts classes

Visual Arts

Portfolio Drawing Requirements (to be submitted at audition/assessment):

- What you see while looking out your window
- A section of your room, including your bed
- A pair of shoes
- Something from your imagination
- In addition to the above requirements, it is important that applicants bring other examples of their work including artwork from art classes, work that has been completed independently, and sketch books.

Drawing Assessment:

The student will have 30 minutes to draw a still life using pencil and erasers that will be set up in room 110.

Your work is evaluated on technical skill, use of composition, and the degree of difficulty of the individual art works.

Criteria for retention of visual arts scholarship

- Design posters for the art, music and theater performances.
- Help set up the major art display in spring
- Enter one art contest
- Work on a mural for display in the school
- Be a member of the Art Club
- Attend fine art performances

Vocal Arts

Vocal Audition

Vocalists: Demonstrate your musical progress through two short pieces (approximately 32 measures) in contrasting styles; one must be a lyrical hymn or folk song (e.g. Amazing Grace, Danny Boy, Shenandoah, Simple Gifts, etc.). Areas observed will include pitch accuracy, rhythmic accuracy, intonation, diction, musical interpretation/style and phrasing. The audition will also include a brief sight singing. If you prefer to sing with an accompaniment you must provide your own accompanist or bring a recording.

Criterion for retention of instrumental music scholarship

- Student will participate in all concert choir performances.
- Student will participate in Luther Singers.
- Student will perform national anthem (either solo or as part of a group) for at least one home basketball game.
- Student will prepare IMEA District Choir audition music. Juniors and seniors will take the audition; freshmen and sophomores will take the audition if they are performing at the appropriate level.
- Student will participate in the IHSA Solo and Ensemble Contest.
- Students must attend one musical performance (college or professional) per semester and write a review of the performance.

The Len-Rich Athletic Foundation Scholarship

One scholarship, every year, will be awarded in the amount of \$4,000.00 to be paid in four (4) equal yearly installments of \$1,000.00. Interested students should complete the Len-Rich Athletic Foundation Scholarship application form. **Due Date-March 15, 2013**

The scholarship is for four years as long as the following criteria are met:

- The winner must maintain at least a 2.0 average.
- The winner must participate in at least one interscholastic sport team each academic year.
- The winner must maintain a good disciplinary record.
- The winner must agree to let the Len-Rich Athletic Foundation use his/her photograph and yearly summary comments in promoting the Foundation.

CLEF (Chicago Lutheran Education Fund) Scholarship

CLEF awards 2 scholarships for students who have graduated from a Lutheran school and are recommended by Luther North College Prep as recipients. The scholarship is \$4000 per year for 4 years unless rescinded by CLEF. **Due Date-April 15, 2013**

Cross Star Grant-in-Aid Program

Luther North College Prep's Cross Star Grant-in-Aid program is designed to assure that talented students will not be denied a LNCP education due to financial circumstances. Grant-in-Aid is funded through generous donations of Alumni and supporters.

To apply for a Cross Star Grant-in-Aid complete an application on the Smart Tuition website beginning February 1, 2013. Once the application has been processed, families will be asked to submit a letter to the admissions committee with any other information they deem relevant to the decision making process. The admissions committee will determine if the family is qualified for financial aid.

All applications must be completed no later than May 15, 2013; a request that is filed late will not be included in the initial aid allotment. As a result, funds may not be available even though the family qualifies for assistance. Because LNCP's financial aid funds are limited, it is possible for a student to be accepted to the school but not receive funding, even though all deadlines have been met.

Students must maintain passing grades; failures or multiple “D” grades will eliminate them from program participation. In addition, any student placed on disciplinary probation may also eliminate them from program participation.

Students receiving financial aid will be required to serve a minimum of 20 approved volunteer hours to the school per school year. Volunteer opportunities can include helping at sporting events, open houses, the main fundraisers or other extracurricular activities. In addition, families of children receiving financial aid will be required to assist LNCP in all major fund-raising events.

Tuition and fees from the previous year must be paid in full. Also, fees and tuition payment contracts must be received on time in order to be eligible. Tuition payments received late will result in loss of all financial aid.
